About IELTS Exam

The International English Language Testing System (IELTS) is an international standardized test of English language proficiency for non-native English speakers. IELTS is jointly owned by the British Council, IDP IELTS, and Cambridge University Press and Assessment.

The IELTS is designed to help you work, study, or migrate to a country where English is the native language. This includes countries such as Australia, Canada, New Zealand, the UK, and the USA.

English is the third most spoken language in the world, with 379 million speakers worldwide. If you are looking to work, live, or study in an English-speaking country, then you must be able to demonstrate a high level of English language ability.

Being able to communicate in English is a basic requirement to study or work in countries where English is the native language. It is also essential for job opportunities as well as integration into the community.

IELTS provides a reliable and consistent measure of English language proficiency.

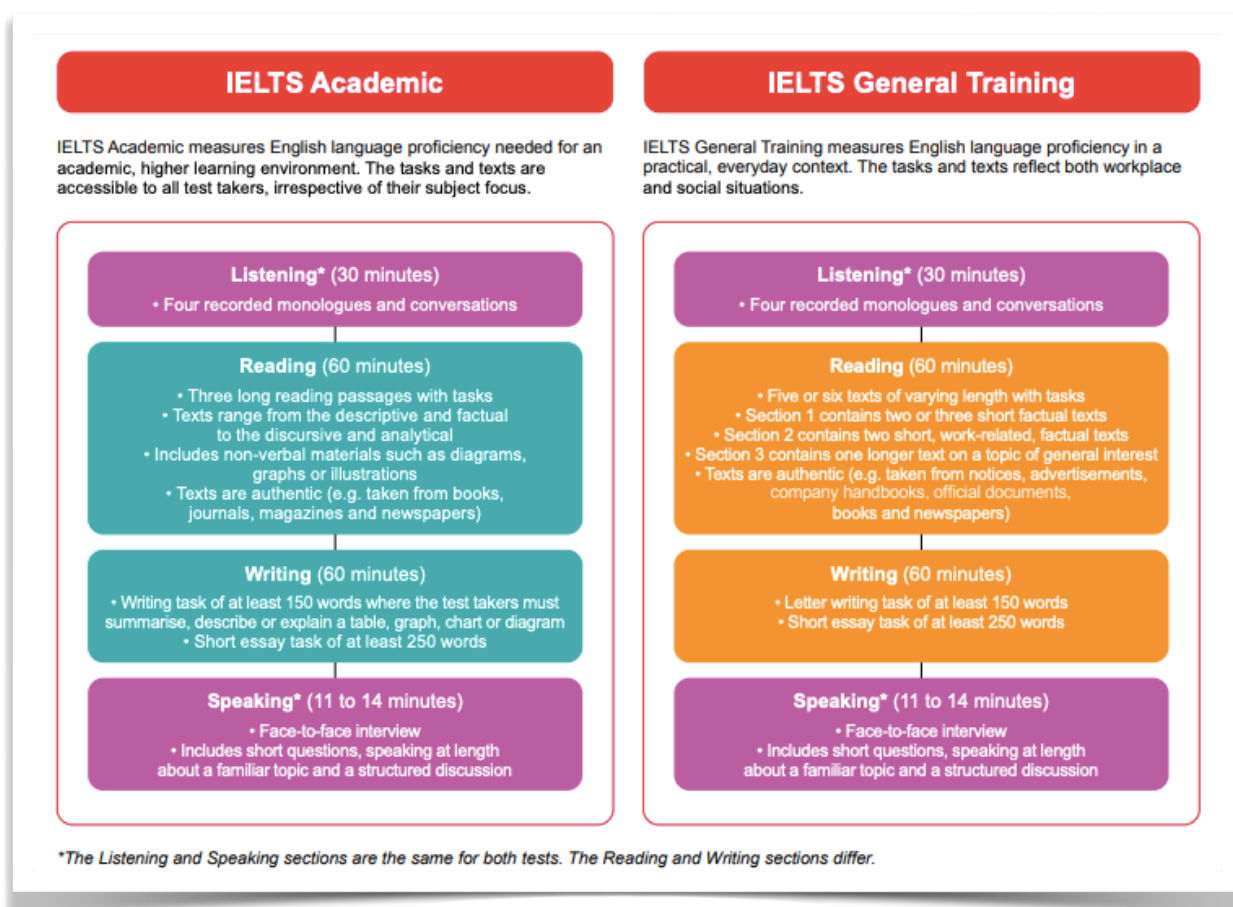
IELTS is the most popular test for those looking to migrate to Australia, Canada, New Zealand, and the UK. It is accepted by over 10,000 organisations in over 140 countries worldwide, including universities, employers, professional bodies, and immigration authorities.

IELTS Exam Structure

IELTS offers a choice of two types of tests - Academic and General Training. IELTS Academic is meant for those looking to study abroad, and IELTS General Training is meant for those looking to migrate or work abroad. Test takers can opt to take both IELTS Academic and IELTS General Training in either paper-based or computer-delivered modes.

Both IELTS Academic and IELTS General Training test the four language skills - Listening, Reading, Writing and Speaking. All the test takers take the same Listening and Speaking sections. There are different Reading and Writing sections for IELTS Academic and IELTS General Training.

Listening section requires the candidate to listen to recordings of texts and



answer questions either on paper or directly on computer depending upon the mode of exam delivery chosen.

IELTS includes a face-to-face Speaking test. The Speaking test is conducted in a private room, one-on-one with an examiner.

IELTS Results and Band Scale

IELTS assesses the test taker's ability to use English. Results are reported as band scores, on a scale from 1 (the lowest) to 9 (the highest).

Test takers receive a Test Report Form (TRF) showing their scores on each of the four sections: Listening, Reading, Writing, and Speaking. Each of the four scores is equally weighted. The overall band score is then calculated by taking the average of the total of the four individual section scores.

Test Result Forms are posted or available for pick up from the test center on the 13th day after the paper-based test or within 5 to 7 days after the computer-delivered test.

The IELTS test scores are valid for two years.

9	Expert user	Has fully operational command of the language: appropriate, accurate and fluent with complete understanding.
8	Very good user	Has fully operational command of the language with only occasional unsystematic inaccuracies and inappropriacies. Misunderstandings may occur in unfamiliar situations. Handles complex, detailed argumentation well.
7	Good user	Has fully operational command of the language, although with occasional inaccuracies, inappropriacies and misunderstandings in some situations. Generally handles complex language well and understands detailed reasoning.
6	Competent user	Has generally effective command of the language despite some inaccuracies, inappropriacies and misunderstandings. Can use and understand fairly complex language, particularly in own field.
5	Modest user	Has partial command of the language, coping with overall meaning in most situations, though is likely to make many mistakes. Should be able to handle basic communication in own field.
4	Limited user	Basic competence is limited to familiar situations. Has frequent problems in understanding and expression. Is not able to use complex language.
3	Extremely limited user	Conveys and understands only general meaning in very familiar situations. Frequent breakdowns in communication occur.
2	Intermittent user	No real communication is possible except for the most basic information using isolated words or short formulae in familiar situations and to meet immediate needs. Has great difficulty understanding spoken and written English.
1	Not user	Essentially has no ability to use the language beyond possibly a few isolated words.
0	Did not attempt the test	No assessable information provided.

What IELTS bands do I need?

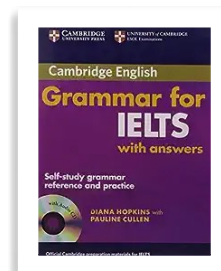
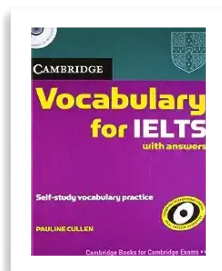
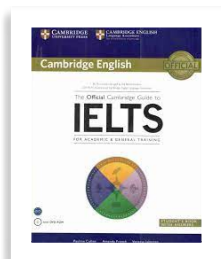

Various universities across the UK, Canada, Australia, the US, New Zealand, etc. stipulate specific minimum band score requirements for different courses. Various organisations and professional bodies ask for different minimum IELTS band scores.

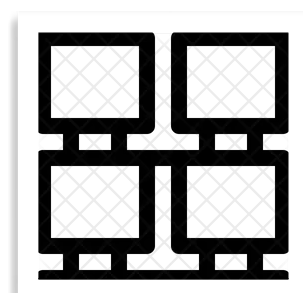
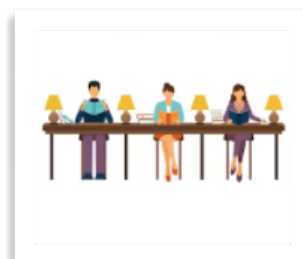

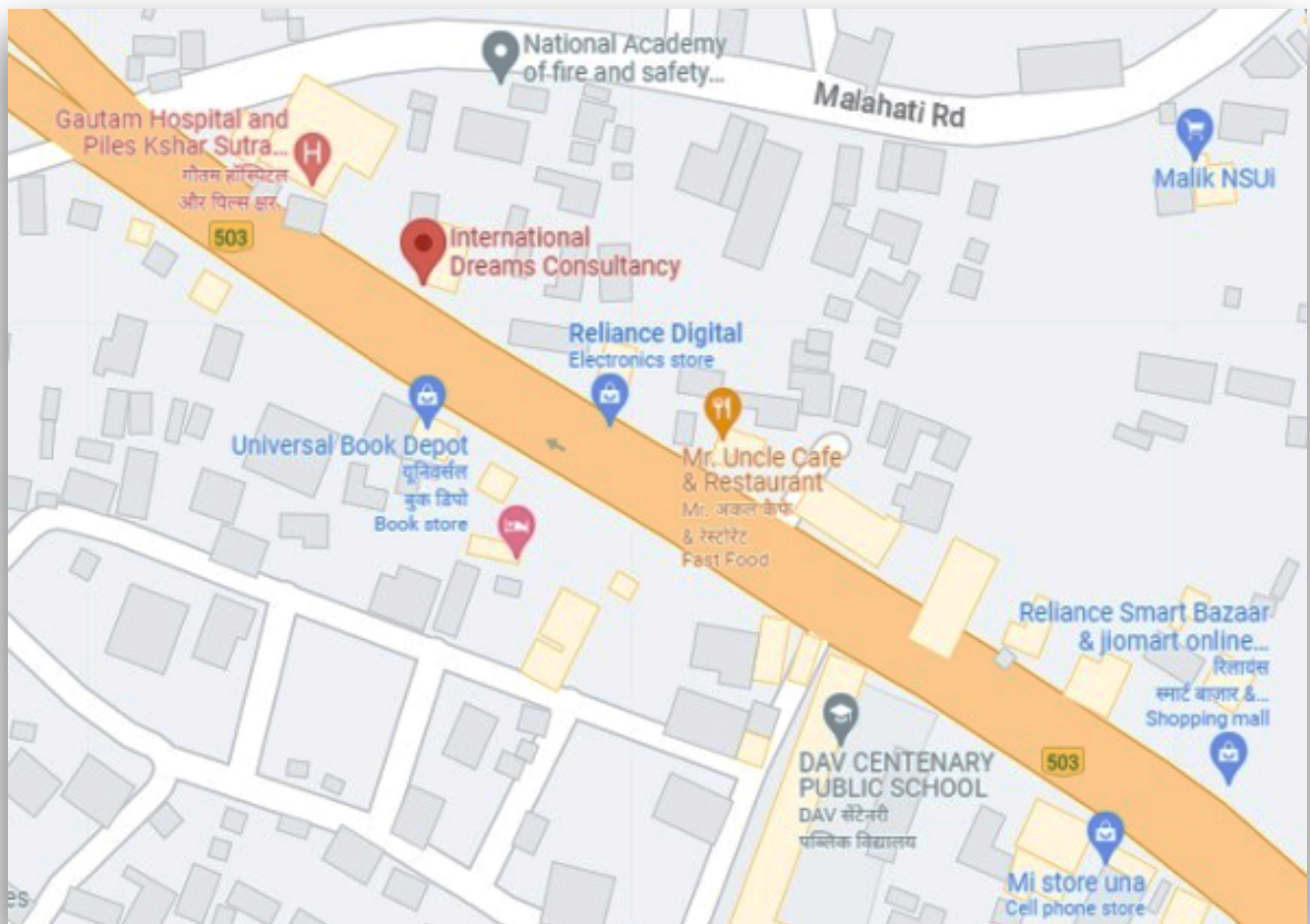
After the Completion of the Course
